Inventory Questions-Still looking for more Feedback

The purpose of the Area 74 Inventory is to make changes to the Area Assembly. The changes will occur due to the results of the Inventory. Hopefully the result will be Area Motions to help resolve some of the issues found.

- 1) What can we do to make Area 74 more attractive to our groups, districts?
- 2) What can the Area do to help members of the Area Assembly be better prepared as we come to participate?
- 3) Do we effectively integrate new people into the Area Assembly?
- 4) How are the Steps, Traditions, and Concepts guiding our decisions and actions when we conduct business at assemblies?

"SPOTLIGHT ON DISTRICTS"

INTRODUCTION

Between the 2019 Spring and Fall Assemblies, an ad-hoc committee met several times via phone conference to brainstorm ideas about what could or should be included in the electronic version of the Now and Then. Of the many ideas suggested, one stood out as a fun and interesting way to educate our readers about Area 74. We came up with a loose format (the following questionnaire) and coined it "Spotlight on Districts."

We'd like to include this as a regular feature of the Now and Then beginning with the January 2020 issue. Use the questionnaire to get ideas flowing, but don't feel like you must answer all the questions. If there's anything that strikes you as important about your district that is not in the questionnaire, feel free to write about it.

You can write an article, or just provide answers to the questions and the Now and Then editors will shape it into an article. We'll start with Districts 01 and 02 and continue in numerical order. DCMs, feel free to delegate this task to someone in your district who takes a particular interest in the history and happenings of AA on your turf.

We hope this feature will be a welcome inclusion to the Now and Then.

Spotlight on Districts Questionnaire

The intention of this questionnaire is to have the DCM for your district, the Alternate, or district contact fill it out so it can be published in the Now and Then as an article. Each month 2 districts will be highlighted in the Now and Then for Area 74. As our trusted servants, our Now and Then editors have editing authorization and will use that as needed.

These questions are suggested to get your thoughts flowing. You don't have to answer every single one. The Now and Then Co-editors greatly appreciate you taking the time to submit an article about your district.

- 1. What geographical area does your district serve? Include counties, cities, tribal lands, and/or any significant landmarks.
- 2. How many meetings and/or active groups does your district have?
- 3. How many meeting locations does your district utilize?
- 4. Is there something unique about your district that makes it stand out?
- 5. How far does your DCM travel for service meetings?
- 6. What else does your district do to help the still suffering alcoholic? (jail meetings, intergroups, special service sessions, etc.)
- 7. Is there any history that you would like to share? (example: date of your oldest meeting, did someone in your district attend a meeting with Bill or Bob?)
- 8. When was your district founded?
- 9. Any recent or upcoming events?
- 10. Any unusual or significant bit of trivia or something special you do at GSR meetings?

These are suggestions only. A district may choose to answer all, some, or none of the questions., and may choose to submit a completely different article or document.

FINAL CPC REPORT (2018-2019)

OCTOBER 26TH 2019

First of all, I would like to thank Area 74 for the opportunity to be of service these past two years. It has been a blessing and a joy. I have met many great people and made many great connections. I will continue to follow up and work with these connections.

I thought I would just update what I have done over the past two years since I am not only accountable to the still suffering alcoholic but also to this body.

- In year one I spent a week in Menomonie, WI. at the annual National Rural Institute on Alcohol and Drug Abuse training. We had a booth in the presenter area. GSO did not register us for year two.
- In both years set up a booth at Schoolcraft Memorial Hospital annual health fair weekend. I
 was between the Sault tribe of Chippewa Indians and the hospital booths so had some
 great networking.
- Year two—CPC workshop in Munising, MI.
- Year two I gave a PowerPoint presentation at Helen Joy Newberry Hospital in Newberry,
 MI. This was to the Eastern U.P. Mental Health Alliance. This included
 - o CEO of Schoolcraft Memorial Hospital
 - o CEO of Upper Peninsula Health Plan, an insurance plan.
 - Hope Network that provides recovery services to businesses.
 - Hospital representatives.
- Year one I gave a presentation to the Ministerial Association of Manistique.
- In both years gave presentations to the following. In all cases handed out meeting lists, pamphlets and, in some cases, books.
 - Schoolcraft Memorial Hospital Community Outreach program.
 - Great Lakes Recovery Centers in several cities.
 - o Sault Tribe of Chippewa Indians in Manistique,
 - o Manistique Drug Court system.
- I have received 10 or so phone calls from various people I have met asking if they could have an alcoholic call me, or could I pick someone up. Got a call to drive someone to rehab.
- Made up 50 packets of information to hand out. Packets included meeting lists, pamphlets, newsletters, business cards, etc.
- Working on a meeting with the local District Court judge and prosecutor. That will happen by the end of the year.
- Blanketed the town with business cards and meeting lists, jails, motels, doctors' offices and any bulletin boards I could find.
- Information sharing session, provide some direction to the local CPC committee in Hancock, MI. Furnished pamphlets to CPC Hancock, MI
- Sent out a pile of CPC workbooks to Iron Mountain, MI. per their request.
- Phone calls and emails from the Area members on how or should we do this or that.
- Served on the Now and Then electronic conversion committee and the Ad-Hoc committee on facilitation of assemblies.

HOW TO PRINT AND DISSEMINATE ISSUES OF THE NOW & THEN

Some suggestions:

- 1. Have individuals send an email to <u>area74newsletter@gmail.com</u> and they can be added to the distribution list for free and receive their own copy.
- 2. Distribute to other home group or AA members via email by forwarding the original email to them.
- 3. Update the Group Information (new GSR or Contact) with the Area 74 Registrar by submitting a Group Change Form and getting the group info updated. If your updated info includes an email address, your group will receive an electronic version automatically. If no email is submitted, the Registrar will provide information on how to proceed.
- 4. Print off the whole electronic version in Black & White to save cost
- 5. Print off the portions of the newsletter the group would like to have in hard copy. Almost every printer has the option to print off only certain pages of a document.

Ex. The Group decides to only print information directly attributed to the communication between the Group and the Area Committee, and to print copies of Area 74 Conference fliers.

Instructions: a. Select 'Print'

b. Under <u>PAGES</u> Click on 'From' Add page to start Ex. 1 Click on 'To' Add page to end Ex. 9

OR if not consecutive pages

c. Under <u>PAGE RANGE</u> Enter page numbers or page ranges separated by commas (e.g. 1-3,6,8,10-12,17,18) thus eliminating unwanted pages.

6. Use the Enrollment Form and pay the \$25 subscription fee to receive an abridged version.

We hope sharing these options helps in distributing the Now & Then, your written communication vehicle between the Area Committee and your group and individual members of Area 74.
