My name is Char V. I am an alcoholic. It is an honor and privilege to be serving as your Area 74 Panel 70 Delegate for Northern Wisconsin and the Greater part of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. My home group is the Kaukauna Group in District 02. I have a sponsor and sponsor others. I have served in a few positions at the Area, District, Home Group and at a Central Office. I have been blessed to have many service-oriented people in my life that have shared their experience. District 02 has been rooted in the importance of General Service work with having several trusted servants serve as Delegate. My friend's words always bring it back to basics when I feel confused with the process and ask, "Why do we do this?" He simply states, "I want a chair to be there for my grandkids if needed."

Within an hour of being elected, I was invited to share my story at the 2020 Spring Conference in Ashland, Wisconsin Friday May 15, 2020. I hope to see you there. An Area conference is an opportunity to participate in the three legacies of AA (Recover, Unity and Service) for the weekend. The theme of conference is 2020 A Vision for You. On Saturday May 16, 2020 I will giving a report on the 70<sup>th</sup> General Service Conference which has the theme "2020: A Clear Vision for You." I want to hear what your thoughts are on having a Conference Advisor, increasing seed money for conferences, having a conference committee, Districts working together to host a conference, are the current Guidelines enough? What does this fellowship want to see happen?

I look forward to meeting you and hearing your thoughts at the Delegate's Workshop Saturday March 7, 2020 in Beautiful Three Lakes, Wisconsin.

#### From the Area Chair

Greetings Area 74,

Hello Area 74! Dawn here from District 20. First, I'd like to thank you for allowing me to serve you as Area 74 Chair Alternated Delegate Panel 70. I am grateful for this opportunity more than I can express. It is my great pleasure to introduce our interviewee of the month, Karen. I asked if she would share why she still loves serving our Fellowship. The following was her reply.

#### Greetings-

When Dawn asked me to write an article for the <u>Now and Then</u> about "What has kept me in service?" the first thought that entered my mind was ----I'm crazy!!! We were at the Fall Conference and the voting for officers had just ended. I somehow had talked myself into standing for the Correction Chair for U.P., and seeing no one else wanted the position there was no problem with getting voted into that slot.

My service started with emptying ash trays (everyone smoked at that time) and washing coffee mugs after the meeting. It was maybe a year later that I was talked into doing the Monday night meeting at detox for the treatment center. I'd never been to treatment so I couldn't understand why they wanted me to do that, but I did whatever they told me to do. I don't know if I ever helped anyone but they helped me. The main thing I learned was that memorizing the Big Book didn't keep anyone sober. Many of the people in detox were people I knew from meetings. They all knew a lot more about A.A. than I did. When I first started this I'm not sure I'd even read the Big Book. They would tell me all kinds of good things, but knowing it isn't the same as applying it to your life on a regular basis. I went there every Monday night for 10 years. I'm a slow learner!!!

Around year two or three, two men came to my home and asked if I wanted to go to Waupun. My answer was, "Why would I want to go to Waupun prison?" Their answer was, "You're an alcoholic aren't you?" That started my love and passion for corrections. Also around that time lots of women started coming to A.A. Now another love, sponsorship. I've done many different kinds of service over the years but my love and passion for corrections and sponsorship has never left me.

So why do I stay in service? After thinking about it, the answer is gratitude to God for the gift of sobriety and to Alcoholics Anonymous for the new way of life they have given me. I've been sober since February 14, 1977. Now after all these years I pray I never get the idea in my head I don't need to work all the steps any more. The 12<sup>th</sup> step says, "We tried to carry the message to alcoholics." It doesn't say for 10 or 20 years. This program is a way of life that I've been blessed to have been given. It's still one day at a time, meetings and doing the next right thing. It's worked for me all this time and with your help and the Grace of God I know it will work today.

### HOW TO PRINT AND DISSEMINATE ISSUES OF THE NOW & THEN

We have heard much positive feedback about the electronic version of the Area 74 newsletter. The most frequent problem many groups are relaying to us is it takes too much paper/ink to print off copies of the monthly issues. We have been instructing members through direct correspondence on what to do and thought it might be beneficial to include methods to get the newsletter, or portions of it, to other members of the group(s).

Some suggestions:

- 1. Have individuals send an email to <a href="mailto:area74newsletter@gmail.com">area74newsletter@gmail.com</a> and they can be added to the distribution list for free and receive their own copy.
- 2. Distribute to other home group or AA members via email by forwarding the original email to them.
- 3. Update the Group Information (new GSR or Contact) with the Area 74 Registrar by submitting a Group Change Form and getting the group info updated. If your updated info includes an email address, your group will receive an electronic version automatically. If no email is submitted, the Registrar will provide information on how to proceed.
- 4. Print off the whole electronic version in Black & White to save cost
- 5. Print off the portions of the newsletter the group would like to have in hard copy. Almost every printer has the option to print off only certain pages of a document.
  - Ex. The Group decides to only print information directly attributed to the communication between the Group and the Area Committee, and to print copies of Area 74 Conference fliers.

Instructions: a. Select 'Print'

b. Under <u>PAGES</u> Click on 'From' Add page to start Ex. 1 Click on 'To' Add page to end Ex. 9

OR if not consecutive pages

- c. Under <u>PAGE RANGE</u> Enter page numbers or page ranges separated by commas (e.g. 1-3,6,8,10-12,17,18) thus eliminating unwanted pages.
- 6. Use the Enrollment Form and pay the \$25 subscription fee to receive an abridged version. We hope sharing these options helps in distributing the Now & Then, your written communication vehicle between the Area Committee and your group individual members of Area 74.
