Delegate's Corner

Greetings Area 74,

Not much happened to report on in the month of July. The only meeting of any significance that I attended was a virtual East Central Regional (ECR) meeting hosted by our ECR Trustee, Cathi C. The geographic area of the East Central Region is composed of Wisconsin, Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. There are 14 Delegate Areas. The topics of discussion centered around how our "report backs" to the our respective Areas have been going and the upcoming ECR Conference in Illinois. For the ECR conference the Delegates could pick a topic from a list and then prepare a presentation or a workshop. I picked the topic of "Using technology in AA Meetings. I am still working on the presentation, but when it is finished, I will be glad to share it.

I have stated before that my usual morning routine consists of coffee, meditation, and prayer while I stare out my front window. Lately I have been adding some reading to that routine. I decided to re-read the stories in the back of the Fourth edition of the Big Book. I have read these stories before, but it has been several years. One of the stories really got my attention this time around. In Part II, "They stopped in Time", story 16 called "Acceptance was the Answer, on page 420, the AA member talks about how his "serenity is inversely proportional to my expectations." That is the same thought that I have been having for the last couple of months. I have found that my expectations and my entitlements have been one of the chief causes for a lot of my resentments. If I can reduce my expectations and entitlements to as close to zero as possible, my serenity increases.

It seems that any insights I have about how life should be lived all came from the program of recovery as laid out in the book Alcoholics Anonymous or from other members of Alcoholics Anonymous when they tell their stories.

The East Central Regional Conference was held in Lisle Illinois, just to the west of Chicago. I rode down there with Nicholas SS and Shannon S. Both Nicholas and Shannon were of great help with the presentation we gave on "Using Technology in AA Meetings". We set up the equipment for a hybrid style meeting, gave a short PowerPoint presentation on the history of technology used in AA meetings, and then had Shannon S and Travis O share their experience on recovery during the pandemic. Shannon was live and Travis was back in Eau Claire and on Zoom. Afterwards, members from the audience came to the microphone to share their collective experience. I enjoyed visiting with the other Delegates that I attended the 72nd General Service Conference with. The shared memories will be with me for a lifetime.

Later in the month I was traveling, again (my life is blessed because of this program), and ended up in an AA meeting in Crossville TN. I was greeted at the door, someone shook my hand, I was shown where the coffee was, and they explained the format of the meeting. If it wasn't for their accents, I would have thought I was in one of my own meetings back in Eau Claire. It has been my experience when I attend meetings outside of my home area, the language of the heart is spoken, and I feel at home. The universal truths that are integrated into the principles of the AA recovery program are apparent, no matter where I attend a meeting.

The trustees' Literature Committee has opened a call for recovery stories in response to the 2021 General Service Conference advisory action regarding the pamphlet "A.A. for the Black and African American Alcoholic," stating that the pamphlet be updated to include current stories of recovery and a new title that is respectful and inclusive.

The committee is seeking stories of recovery from all African American, Canadian, Caribbean A.A. members from the English, French and Spanish-speaking Black communities in the A.A. structure in the United States and Canada.

The Preface to the Second Edition of the Big Book explains that revisions to the personal history section of the book were made in order “to represent the current membership of Alcoholics Anonymous more accurately, and thereby to reach more Alcoholics.”

In that spirit, the 2021 General Service Conference recommended that “a Fifth Edition of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect the current membership, keeping in mind the 1995 Advisory Action:

“The first 164 pages of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous, the Preface, the Forewords, ‘The Doctor’s Opinion’, ‘Dr. Bob’s Nightmare’, and the Appendices remain as is.”

In response to the 2021 General Service Conference Advisory Action requesting the development of a Fifth edition of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*, the trustees' Literature Committee is seeking a wide range of A.A. recovery experience of members in the Fellowship.

The trustees' Literature Committee is searching for recovery stories of our members for possible inclusion in the Fifth Edition which are from a broad cross-section of our local communities, all stories are of value. As Bill writes on page 29 of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*: “Our hope is that many alcoholic men and women, desperately in need, will see these pages, and we believe that it is only by fully disclosing ourselves and our problems that they will be persuaded to say, ‘Yes, I am one of them too; I must have this thing.’”

It is the Literature Committee's shared hope that any new stories from our current membership will help future alcoholics to identify and find recovery in the pages of a Fifth edition.

The suggested format for typed manuscripts is 3500 words, double spaced, in 12-point font. Handwritten manuscripts should be approximately 5 to 6 pages. Please include your complete name, address, and email/phone information on the first page of the submission. A copy of your manuscript should be retained for your files.

The anonymity of all authors will be observed whether their story is selected for publication or not. Stories will be accepted in English, French or Spanish. If you have any questions, please write to 5BBStory@aa.org.

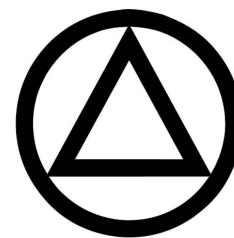
